

Musician Paul's work going around globe

A MUSICAL project involving a South Shields composer/producer could tour the Falkland Islands and tropical Belize.

Outrageous singer Toyah teamed up with Paul Moran, 32, a former pupil at St Wilfrid's Comprehensive, to produce the ground-breaking LP Dreamchild, which is going to be released on May 16.

And a tour, which takes in Durham University on June 16, as the final part of the British leg, will also be going to Belize, Japan and The Falklands later in the year.

Paul, now a member of top pop group Bronski Beat, is part of a production team called Hyper-V along with writer Mike Bennett and house artist Tacye.

He provides the rich orchestrations, which form a backdrop for Tacye's unique atmospherics and Bennett's inspirational lyrics and melodies.

The 11-track album sees experiments in a variety of styles including ambient, trance, industrial and techno.

Dreamchild was just one of several major projects, on which Paul worked last year, including a song for Cher.

London-based Paul first studied piano with Madame Rankin, a well-known figure in South Tyneside musical circles.

He went on to study for a teaching diploma at South Tyneside College but left before completing his second year.

Paul became an entertainer on top people's cruise liner QE2 at the tender age of 20 before teaming up with soundtrack composer Andre Jacquemin.
